

Local Men On Board of New Bank

Six local men are on the board of the Troy National Bank which opened last week in temporary quarters at Livernois and Maple. The bank's initial capitalization is \$500,000. One of the six, Edward

A. Busin of Birmingham, is the bank's president.

The men are Troy Mayor Robert J. Huber; John W. Butler, executive vice president of Demery's, Inc., Detroit and Birmingham, a resident of Bloomfield Township; Sanford C. Stoddard, president of the Michigan Bank; James P. Cumiskey, a vice president of Michigan Bank; and John Larkin, president of the Elco Corp., Troy. Stoddard and Cumiskey are Birmingham residents.

The bank, which is now operating under a six-month temporary occupancy permit, will be open from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Saturday. A new building is planned on the present site, Huber said.

Village Awaits Court Ruling On Zone Suit

BINGHAM FARMS—A court decision is expected within 30 days to settle the long drawn out suit challenging Bingham Farms zoning.

Final arguments were heard Friday. Village Attorney William Hartman said.

The question of annexation of nine acres by Beverly Hills will not be put to voters until the March elections, the council also learned Monday night.

PUTTING THE annexation question on the ballot at the general election in November would require additional personnel to count the village vote, township officials explained. The firm of Andrew and Briggs, who petitioned for the change, have been advised of the postponement, village President Haskell Wright told his colleagues.

DERBY IS presently paid \$6,800 annually by Lathrup. He said he also received about \$1,800 per year from Keego Harbor for his Saturday work, plus \$700-\$800 yearly for extra work he does for that community.

The clerk withdrew his resignation, thus eliminating necessity for Stone to withdraw his acceptance.

EARLIER IN the evening, the audience, comprised mainly of Lathrup residents whose children attend St. Bede's School on 12 Mile Road, protested the withdrawal of city police protection at the school crossing during 45 minutes of the morning rush hour.

The parents said the school had been informed by letter that protection would be withdrawn, effective Oct. 1. The letter came from Stone and Police Chief Tom Tellefsen who said use of the police car and the only policeman on duty at that time left the city without police protection for the period in question.

THE LETTER RESULTED in a petition signed by 380 residents. About 350 Lathrup children attend the school. The City of Southfield supplies a man to assist at the crossing at other times of the day. Mothers man the spot at the lunch hour but claim that some of the drivers are uncooperative.

Stone and Tellefsen said that police had arrived 40 minutes late at the scene of an accident recently and had been late on nine police runs during the last year because of duty at the crossing.

LOUIS S. BERNADOTTE, 18255 Roseland, an attorney speaking for some of the parents, said there was no clearly defined crossing at the school and that the sun and trees partially obscured the approach to St. Bede's.

Bernadotte said the problem at Lathrup School was different in many respects. The latter school uses the janitor to watch children and a move is currently under way to hire civilian help to assist the children across Southfield Road.

STONE REPLIED that Lathrup School children would face increased future hazards with the widening of Southfield. He said the Oct. 1 date was set forth as a target and agreed with council members that the date could be postponed pending solution of the problem.

Both he and Tellefsen said the problem was due to lack of more than one policeman on duty at the same time and said volunteer police help had decreased.

The two-hour discussion ended when it was agreed that a committee will be set up, representing all parties. The committee's goal will be the simultaneous protection of St. Bede children and the city as a whole.
