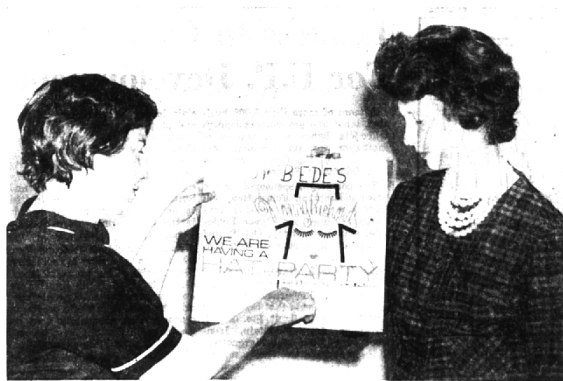


St. James Church Young People Plan Weekend Retreat
