

Lectures Focus On International Scene at MSUO

The impact of Castroism on the United States-Soviet Union cold war balance will be discussed by Dr. Samuel Shapiro of Michigan State University Oakland at 8:15 p.m. Oct. 1.

His lecture is the first of a series of three on critical international areas co-sponsored by the Division of Continuing Education, MSUO, and the Altrama Club of Birmingham. The lectures, all by members of the MSUO faculty, will focus on Latin America, England and the Common Market, and Communist China.

They will be given Oct. 1, 15, and 29 in Kingswood Auditorium, Cran-

brook Road, Bloomfield Hills. Tickets are available from the Altrama Club and at the Village Bookshelf, 790 N. Woodward, Birmingham.

SHAPIRO, assistant professor of history, opens the series with a talk on Latin America which will include current discussion of Cuba. He was a Fulbright professor of American history at the Universities of Tucuman and Buenos Aires, Argentina and has traveled extensively in Latin America.

of history, on Oct. 15. A former Fulbright scholar who studied at both the University of London and the London School of Economics and Political Science, he will try to assess the effects of England's membership in the Common Market.

DR. CHARLES O. HUCKER, professor of history and chairman of the committee on Asian studies, will discuss "China: Persisting Enigma" in a look at China's transition toward a modern communist state on Oct. 29. Dr. Hucker has been a resident research scholar in Taiwan, Formosa and Kyoto, Japan.

Give Romney Team Support, Say Two State Candidates

Elect George Romney as governor and give him an administrative team from the same party is the campaign theme of Republican candidates to state office. Two candidates, visiting The Eccentric and other area newspapers, stressed this theme last week. They are: Glenn S. Allen, Jr., ex-mayor of Kalamazoo and Con-Con delegate, seeking the office of state treasurer; Robert J. Danhoff, former candidate for probate judge and former vice president of the Muskegon County Young Republican Club, seeking the office of attorney general.

IN HIS VISIT to The Eccentric, Allen said: "Michigan's never going to get back on the track until we have a governor and a legislature of the same party. "I think we need to elect George Romney and then have a fiscal team who will work with him."

Allen said Romney appears to be "running very well" on the state level so far in his campaign. As for other state candidates, he felt that "people don't even know as a rule that they are to be elected. The governor's hands will be tied and his programs sabotaged if he doesn't have a fiscal team that is sympathetic to his point of view."

Allen said it is "too early now" to be specific as to his ideas for a fiscal program. "I will spell that out as the campaign goes along."

DANHOFF MADE this statement: "The attorney general is peculiarly charged under the new constitution to recommend changes in existing laws. To elect Romney and not elect an attorney general of the same party would place the type of recommendations we would get in jeopardy. "If Romney is elected, he should be given men with him to do the job. We should not keep the divided responsibility we have had in the past year. "It is time we return to government to the people."

Both Danhoff and Allen attended the Michigan Municipal League convention in Detroit after their visit to the Birmingham-Bloomfield area.
