**Lathrup, Southfield Circulate Petitions Against Detroit Tax**

Petitions to counteract the Detroit income tax are being circulated in Lathrup and the City of Southfield. The petitions are also available to citizens who wish to sign them in the city halls of both cities.

The petitions have, as their purpose, the outlaying of such a tax on non-residents. The drive, it is hoped, would result in submission of initiatory legislation early in January or submission of the issue to the voters of Michigan in the 1963 Spring election.

The Vigilance Tax Committee has designated Oct. 2 as a day for a special drive in Southern Oakland County to obtain signatures to the petitions. Southfield Mayor James Clarkson and Lathrup Mayor Richard N. Coogler are spearheading the drive in their home cities.
