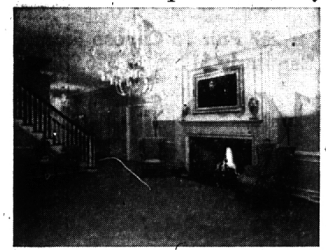

## St. James to Hear Lecture on Brazil

The Rev. Charles A. Moya, St. James Episcopal Mission, Belem, Brazil, will speak to the Episcopal Church Women of St. James Parish about the work of the church in Brazil on Wednesday at the church.

## Ann Arbor Minister, Rev. Geade, Trades Pulpit on Sunday

Rev. Erwin A. Geade, minister of the First Unitarian Church of Ann Arbor, will exchange pulpits with Robert Marshall Sunday at 10:30 a.m. His sermon topic is "Martin Luther: A Psychological Study."

Rev. Geade graduated from the Divinity School of the University of Chicago and has his Ph.D. from Notre Dame in political science. He served Congregational churches in Argo, Ill., and Madison, Wis., before becoming a Unitarian minister.

His Unitarian pastorate was the First Unitarian Church of South Bend, Ind., and the Unitarian Society of Westwood, Calif., where he was minister for five years, prior to coming to Ann Arbor a year ago.

## St. James Opens Opportunity Shop For New Season

The Opportunity Shop at St. James Episcopal Church, which has been closed for the holidays, will re-open Tuesday. Spring clothing may be brought in after Jan. 15.

The "Op Shop" is a resale shop operated by the Episcopal Church Women of St. James. Clothing and other items may be consigned to the shop, 30 percent of the sale going to the shop and the remaining 70 percent to the consignor.

All members of the community are invited to participate in the buying and selling operations of the "Op Shop."

The shop is open Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. On Saturday the hours are from 9:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

Rev. Moya's church, which is at the mouth of the Amazon River, is a former British chaplaincy. Since the property and the church proper were turned over to the Episcopal Church early in 1961, a strong emphasis has been given to evangelization among the Brazilian population, as well as carrying on the ministry to the English-speaking community in the area.

The sickness and misery among the indigent in this tropical climate has made it almost imperative to do work in these two areas, church officials say.

The visit of the prominent Pontiac Negro will mark the feast of the Epiphany, when the three wise men, representing three different races of mankind, reached the birthplace of the Messiah. It will also commemorate the centennial of the Emancipation Proclamation, which became law under Abraham Lincoln in January, 1862.

## Add Teachers In Oakland

A gain in the number and caliber of Oakland County teachers was indicated in a statistical report prepared by the County Board of Education staff for 1962.

A total of 7,650 teachers and administrators are under contract in the 29 local school districts of the county. This is an increase of 285 over last year.

A survey of teacher qualifications showed that 2,042 hold Master's degrees. Last year the number was 1,900.

At the same time, the number of teachers with less than four years of college preparation dropped from 318 to 201.

There are 36 persons holding doctorate degrees, including 11 members of the County Board of Education staff.
