**Sablich Returns from Trip Hunting Ram in Arizona**

Milan Sablich of Townhill Dr. arrived home for the holidays after hunting ram in Arizona. He and his companion, Dr. E. E. Ludwig of Rochester, traveled to the northern part of Arizona at the beginning of the ram hunting season, Dec. 1. Only six out-of-state ram hunting licenses were issued, and the two men were among the fortunate licensees. They camped and carried their own food and water through the desolate country, hunting the ram that never turned up. They journeyed on along the Colorado River and down near the Mexican Border where Sablich shot a male and a female mountain lion.

The male measured eight feet, one inch, and weighed 220 pounds. The female weighed 140 pounds and was six-and-a-half-feet long. She is being totally mounted and will grace the trophy room cocktail table. The male is also being mounted and will take his place on the wall along with Sablich's other prizes.

To date, Sablich has hunted in Alaska, British Columbia, Alberta, Montana, Wyoming and Arizona, and has his eye on Africa or Rhodesia for next year's hunt. His kill includes three rams, two moose, mountain goat, grizzly bear, antelope and wolf, plus the skulls and heads of nine white-tailed deer.
