

SWIMMING

SATURDAY RECREATION CENTERS
The Southfield Department of Parks and Recreation in cooperation with the Southfield public school system will open nine neighborhood school centers starting Saturday for boys and girls six years and up.

Centers will be open from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the following centers: Birney, Evergreen and 11 Mile; Brace, Evergreen and Midway; East Southfield, Glasgow and Whitshire; John Grace, Emmet and Indian; Lederle, 9 Mile and Northwestern; McKinley, Southfield and 11 Mile; Northbrook, 1900 West 12 Mile; Southfield No. 10, 25040 Berg Road (9 to 12 only); and Magnolia, 17050 Dorset (9 to 12 only).

Age groups will be set with 11 year olds in the mornings and 12 years and older boys and girls attending in the afternoon. The program will offer arts and crafts projects for boys and girls six to 11 years old in the mornings. Crafts projects such as figurine painting, textured leather, basketry, jewelry, finger painting and others will be available.

Crafts projects will be available for beginners on advanced level in textiles, mosaics, leather, jewelry and others. Special events such as kite flying and model building will also be available during the program. Gym activities such as basketball, paddle tennis, wiffle ball, volleyball, and girls basketball and volleyball are also available.

OPTIMIST-RECREATION BASKETBALL
Twenty-four teams in three age divisions will kickoff the 1962-63 edition of the Optimist-sponsored Department of Parks and Recreation basketball program starting on Saturday at Southfield High School. Games are scheduled from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Monday evenings for the senior leagues.

All teams are filled to capacity and a waiting list presently exists for prospective players. The program, under the supervision of Robert Neff, will run for 10 weeks with championship games being played at the end of the program.

Sports Show Planned for Detroit Area

The world's largest sports and recreation exposition is coming to Detroit March 1 through 10 at the Michigan State Fair Grounds. Thomas E. Durant, producer of the Chicago show which attracts 350,000 persons annually, has leased four State Fair Buildings including the Coliseum.

THE EXPOSITION, to be known here as the Detroit Sportsman's and Vacation Show, will be held annually, Durant announced.

"Detroit is widely known as a great sports town and we believe that given a sports show second to none Detroit outdoorsmen will enjoy it and give their all-out support," Durant said.

In Chicago, Durant's sports show has become a civic institution attended by most of the city's leaders and sports figures as well as the average sportsman.

Detroit outdoorsmen will see all features of the internationally famed Chicago show including the mammoth "Parade of Outdoor Champions," a 14-hour stage show which will introduce to the Detroit area a host of events and champions from various parts of the United States. This will be held twice daily in the Coliseum where more than 6,000 seats will be available without additional charge.

ANOTHER BUILDING will be devoted to "Tackle Row," with demonstrations of all the newest rods and reels, the live trout fishing pool for public participation, two casting pools, exhibits of guns, golf equipment and archery.

Vacation and travel exhibits will occupy another building. Then there will be a marine section showing fishing boats and motors and a big area devoted to camping and the pick-up camper. Another feature will be a sports theater with continuous hunting and fishing movies from Michigan and all over the United States.

Durant said that actually his show is about a half dozen shows in one with displays and exhibits from as far away as New York, Florida, Washington and Canada. His Detroit address is Detroit Sportsman's and Vacation Show, Michigan State Fair Grounds, Detroit (3) Mich.

lights for night skiing, a big lodge, overnight accommodations and a 1500-car parking lot. Both Alpine Valley and Pine Knob are about 15 miles from Birmingham.

OTHER RESORTS within easy driving distance are Dryden, 18 miles north of Rochester on Hough Road; Grampian Mountain, on Lakewille Road, 12 miles north of Pontiac; Mt. Holly, 25 miles north of Birmingham, off US-10; and Mount Brighton, one mile northwest of Brighton, off US-16. It takes some money, some know-how, and some precautions to have a beginner's enjoyment with this wintery sport, but skiing should not be overlooked as a fun possibility by either young or not-too-old.

NEARLY ALL ski shops have rental equipment, and that includes shops located at ski areas, plus the bigger sporting goods stores in cities and towns.

If you become a member of a club (and this is a good inexpensive way to get acquainted with the sport) then the club may have a rental-purchase agreement with a local ski shop, so rental costs can apply against later equipment purchases.
