Paranthood Classes Hold Registration

Expectant parents classes will begin in Birmingham and Royal Oak the week of Jan. 14. Registration for the classes must be made at the Royal Oak Health Center, 2401 E. Fourth St., in Royal Oak on Monday from 6:30 p.m. to 7:30 p.m.

The series of eight classes stresses the "we" of parenthood, helping expectant parents to see they are in a partnership, sharing responsibilities with each contributing to a sound, wholesome family life.

Topics covered include the mental health of the family unit; growth and development of the baby prior to and immediately after birth, labor and delivery; and care and feeding of the infant. A conducted hospital tour is also arranged.

Public health nurses teach the classes which are sponsored by the Oakland County Medical Society, the Oakland County Department of Health and various Adult Education Departments.

The classes meet each week from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m., and there is no charge.

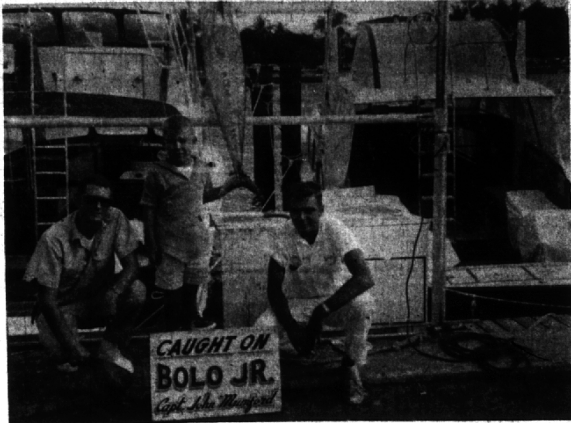

CON-CON REPORT

Citizens Council Offers Free Constitution Study Booklet

A most effective tool for study of the proposed new Michigan constitution has been issued in recent weeks by the Citizens Research Council of Michigan and is now available without charge to interested individuals and study groups.

The 40-page publication is titled, "A Digest of the Proposed Constitution," and may be procured by addressing a request to the Citizens Research Council in Detroit, 1520 David Stott Building or Lansing, 204 Haugh Building.

The Council is a private, non-profit organization which conducts continuing, factual research into public affairs and governmental problems at the state and local level.

The group never takes stands on ballot issues and never attempts to tell people how to vote. It finds and publicizes unbiased and non-political facts on the basis of which citizens can then make their

own decisions on the course of public affairs.

MICHIGAN VOTERS are being asked to accept or reject an entire new state constitution at the April 1, 1965, election. The CRC publication answers possible objections to this "package" approach by pointing out that voting on the new constitution as a unit avoids "the likelihood of introducing conflicting or inconsistent provisions through the merger of new and old language."

It points out further that "like the present constitution, the provisions of the proposed document can be altered, amended or revised as time goes by."

In addition to discussion of changes proposed in the new constitution, the Council publication devotes space to a review of those provisions of the document which retain traditional Michigan practices.

Among such fiscal provisions continued are listed: the 15-mill limit, earmarking of gasoline and weight taxes for highway purposes, the present four-cent limit on sales tax, earmarking of sales tax for schools and local units, state loans to school districts, and restriction of voting on bond issues to property owners and their spouses.

PRESENT political provisions retained without basic change include the initiative, referendum and recall; home rule for cities and villages; traditional forms of local government; and the state's duties and responsibilities in the field of education.

Also continued, says the publication, is "the Michigan principle of a separate, strong, self-financed, constitutional control of the civil service and merit system for state employees."

The concluding pages of the Digest contain a 100-Question Quiz which has been prepared as a basis for an intensive study of the contents of the booklet.

The Council has published 75,000

copies of the Digest and reports an unprecedented number of inquiries from citizens throughout the state.
