Can't Stand Clear Of Bounding Deer

A jay-walking deer caused a three-car accident early Wednesday morning in Bloomfield Township.

No one was injured—except the deer, who was dead on arrival at township police headquarters.

The read-end chain collision took place about one block east of Emerson on Square Lake Road at 6:40 a.m.

No tickets were issued, according to police officer Harry Bentley. "not unless the deer got one, but we gave him life".

ALL CARS were headed east on Square Lake Road.

The deer, headed south, leaped into the middle of the road and into the path of a car driven by Eugene R. Thomas, 37, of 2935 Hickory Grove, Bloomfield Hills.

"Either the deer ran into the car or the car ran into it. We don't know which," said Officer Bentley.

Thomas told police he tried to avoid hitting the animal but could not.

POLICE SAID his car was struck from behind by a car driven by Stefan Ankowski, 48, of Pontiac.

The Ankowski car, in turn, was struck in the rear by a car driven by Gregory Humphrey, 46, 2925 Hickory Court, Bloomfield Township, according to police.

There were no passengers in any of the cars.

Area Driver Faces Trial In Auto Death

A Bloomfield Township truck driver was bound over to Wayne County Circuit court at his examination Tuesday afternoon before Dearborn Township Justice of the Peace Clarence R. Constan. He is charged with manslaughter with a motor vehicle.

Norman J. Sinclair, 54, of 2682 Walnut Lake Road, pleaded not guilty at the examination. Bond was continued at \$7,500 and he was posted.

Sinclair was charged as a result of the death of August Sawinski, 53, of Taylor Township, according to Dearborn Township police.

WITNESSES TOLD police that Sinclair ran a red light and collided with a car driven by Sawinski. The accident occurred at Van Born and Telegraph on Dec. 14.

On a second charge, possession of an unregistered gun, Sinclair asked for a jury trial. The trial will be held before Judge Constan on Tuesday. Sinclair has posted a \$2,000 bond on this charge.
