

Lutherans Install Pastor's Son

"Homecoming" is the word around Lutheran Church of the Redeemer in Birmingham this month as the Rev. Duane T. Wuggazer has arrived from California to assume the office of assistant pastor with his father, the Rev. Theodore Wuggazer.

Rev. Duane Wuggazer is the third member of his family to have served the Lutheran Church of the Redeemer congregation. In 1931, Rev. Theodore Wuggazer, Jr., was installed by his father, the Rev. Theodore Wuggazer, Sr. This three-generation story is unique in Birmingham church history.

Born and raised in Birmingham, Pastor Duane, as he is called to distinguish the two Pastor Wuggazers now, brings with him a knowledge of the community and of the congregation, which will help significantly in extending the

program of Redeemer congregation. Pastor Duane will be installed by his father in a special afternoon service on Sunday at 4 p.m. The Rev. Victor Halbois, Jr., of Grace Lutheran Church, Redford, a close friend of Pastor Duane, will preach the installation sermon.

Rev. Pauling Officiates At Ground Breaking

Ground-breaking ceremonies for the new Cross of Christ Lutheran Church were held Sunday, Dec. 30, with the Rev. Delayne Pauling, pastor of the congregation, officiating.

The church will be built on a seven-acre site at the northwest corner of Lone Pine and Telegraph roads in Bloomfield Township. Frederick Sichel Associates of Birmingham are the architects.

"We have attempted to capture the contemporary ecclesiastical spirit in the design of this church," the architect says.

The building exterior is field stone, vertical wood siding with a shingled roof which is compatible with the site and its suburban environment.

The building will contain a sanctuary seating 170 persons, Sunday School and administration facilities, and has been designed to permit additions and expansion.

The congregation will move from their present church on the corner of Square Lake and Telegraph roads when the new church building is completed this spring.
