Juniors Meet

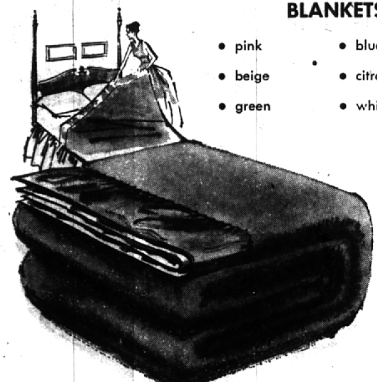

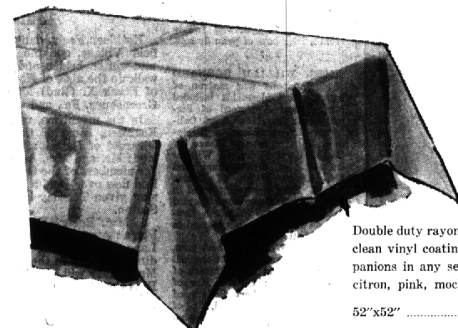

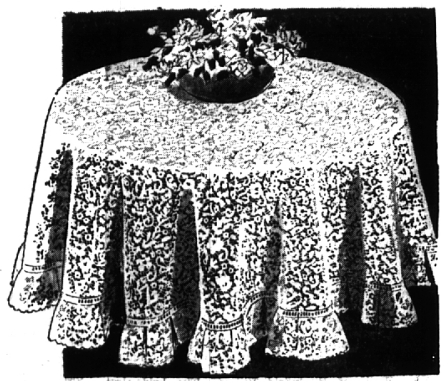
