A Dream Realized In Birmingham Today

A dream designated as "visionary" by some will become a living reality today when Birmingham Musicals' president, Mrs. John C. Wright, Jr., will officially dedicate and present to Thoburn H. Wiant, president of the Community House of Birmingham, a brand new concert Grand Piano.

The ceremony will precede the Musicals' regular concert to be held at 1:30 p.m. in the auditorium at the Community House.

IN THE MIDDLE of a multitude of other worthwhile fund drives being promoted in the community, money, time effort, food and "hostess homes" were donated to the piano project by public spirited citizens not only in the local area but from nearby metropolitan Detroit and Grosse Pointe. When the last week of September finally arrived, proceeds started rolling into Community House, whose executive director, F. Ward Oradnik acted as trustee of funds. Donations kept trickling in until Thanksgiving had passed.

A committee of outstanding pianists in the Birmingham-Bloomfield area was selected by the Musicals to choose the concert grand for the Community House.

THIS IS NOT the first time the Musicals has helped to purchase a piano for the Community. In 1959, after Community House was dedicated, Birmingham Musicals, then only four years old, spearheaded a drive for a grand piano. The instrument bought after that drive was a piano formerly owned by the great Oreste Gabriellivitch and has served the Community House nobly in the intervening years since that time. It is the very same piano that was "honorably" retired before the handsome new model, now gracing Community House auditorium, was installed.

Mrs. Wright's working committee who helped to push the project to fulfillment included Mrs. W. Whiting Raymond in charge of procuring the 100 "hostess homes"; Mrs. Walter F. Skinner, reservation chairman; Mrs. Howard E. Hallas and Mrs. H. S. McFarland, vice presidents of the Musicals who took charge of table prizes and thank-you notes; Mrs. Phillip R. Flanders who was charged with publicity and promotion of the project; and Mrs. Frederick P. Betz, past president of Birmingham Newcomers, who organized countless Newcomers parties.
