**MEMBERS OF 19** surrounding AAUW branches were invited to hear Mrs. H. Loree Harvey of Kalamazoo, division fellowships chairman, speak. She noted that since 1888, when the Association's first fellowship was given, through 1960-61, AAUW fellowships have been awarded to 1,480 women.

The association has built up endowment funds, the interest of which has provided stipends for research by grantees at or near the doctorate level.

Three Michigan women are among the recipients this year. Three African women are among the international recipients. Twenty-nine other countries are represented among the international fellows.
