

**Ford Executive Moves to Position At Westinghouse**

**VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN**

An ordinance, granting to Consumers Power Company, its successors and assigns, the right, power and authority to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges, and other public places, and to do a local gas business in the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan for a period of thirty years.

THE VILLAGE OF FRANKLIN ORDAINS:

SECTION 1  
That wherever the word "Grantee" appears in this ordinance, it is hereby intended to designate, and shall be held to refer to the Consumers Power Company, a corporation duly authorized to do business in the State of Michigan, its successors and assigns.

SECTION 2  
The right, power and authority are hereby granted and vested in the said Grantee to lay, maintain and operate gas mains, pipes and services, on, along, across and under the highways, streets, alleys, bridges and other public places, and to do a local gas business in the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan for a period of thirty years.

SECTION 3  
In consideration of the rights, power and authority hereby granted, all of which shall vest in the Grantee for a period of thirty (30) years as aforesaid, said Grantee shall faithfully perform all things required by the terms hereof.

SECTION 4  
The said Grantee, before entering upon any street, highway, alley, or other public place for the purpose of constructing or installing any mains or pipes, other than service lines, shall notify the Village Clerk in writing of the proposed construction and installation and obtain a permit on a form provided by the Village and shall file an acceptable engineering plan and specification showing the nature and extent of the proposed construction or installation.

SECTION 5  
No highway, street, alley, or bridge or other public place used by said Grantee shall be obstructed longer than necessary during the work of construction or repair, and shall be restored to the same good order and condition as when such work was commenced. No part of the highways, streets, alleys, bridges or other public places of said Village shall be permitted to remain in a dangerous or unsafe condition, by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by the Grantee, and Grantee shall be liable for such damage as may be suffered by any person or corporation by reason of its negligence in the use of such streets, alleys, bridges, or other public places, and shall save harmless the said Village from all damage and liability on account thereof.

SECTION 6  
Said Grantee shall be entitled to charge said Village and its inhabitants for gas, the rates now on file with the Michigan Public Service Commission and with the Village Clerk. Said rates shall be subject to review and change at any time by the Michigan Public Service Commission or its successors, upon proper application by either said Grantee or the Village, acting by the Village Clerk, being made thereto, and the regularly filed rates as approved by said Commission or its successors, as applicable to said Village of Franklin, shall at all times be the lawful rates.

All bills for gas furnished by the Grantee shall be payable monthly. The Grantee may collect the minimum charges as specified in the Grantee's Rate Schedule. The Grantee shall also furnish and maintain commercially accurate meters to measure the gas so furnished, and it shall, by its representatives, have at all reasonable times, access to the premises of its customers, for the purpose of reading, inspecting, removing and replacing such meters.

SECTION 7  
Said Grantee shall construct and extend its gas distribution system within said Village, and shall furnish gas to applicants residing therein, whenever the amount of gas to be furnished thereby shall provide an adequate and reasonable return upon the cost of making such extensions and providing such service.

SECTION 8  
The rights and authority herein granted are not exclusive. Either manufactured or natural gas may be furnished hereunder.

SECTION 9  
Said Grantee, shall, as to all other conditions, elements of service and public safety not herein fixed, be and remain subject to the reasonable rules and regulations of the Michigan Public Service Commission or its successors, applicable to gas service in said Village.

SECTION 10  
The violation of any of the terms of this ordinance by the Grantee shall subject the Grantee to the payment of a fine of not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00).

SECTION 11  
The franchise granted by this ordinance is not subject to revocation, and shall be and become valid and binding only upon its ratification by the affirmative vote of at least two-thirds of the electors of said Village voting thereat at a regular or special municipal election to be held in the manner provided by law. This ordinance shall not be submitted to the electors unless the Grantee shall, within thirty days after the adoption hereof, file with the Village Clerk its written acceptance, subject to the ratification by the electors of the Village of Franklin. Upon the acceptance hereof and the ratification by the electors as aforesaid, this ordinance shall constitute a contract between the Village of Franklin and the Grantee for the full term of thirty (30) years from and after the date of such ratification by the electors.

We hereby certify that the foregoing ordinance was duly enacted by the Village Council of the Village of Franklin, Oakland County, Michigan, on the 7th day of January, 1963.

**VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDINANCE NO. 67**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM OF THE VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS; PROVIDING FOR THE FIXING AND COLLECTION OF RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE USE OF SAID SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM AND FOR CONNECTING TO THE SAME; PROVIDING FOR THE ALLOCATION AND USE OF THE REVENUES DERIVED FROM THE COLLECTION OF SUCH RATES AND CHARGES; PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF SEWAGE IN THE VILLAGE, MAKING CERTAIN METHODS OF THE DISPOSITION OF SEWAGE UNLAWFUL, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES TO FAIL TO CONNECT PREMISES WITH AVAILABLE PUBLIC SEWERS, IMPOSING FINES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO."

THE VILLAGE OF BEVERLY HILLS ORDAINS:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 38 be and the same hereby is amended by the addition of a new sub-section to be known as Section 4.02 reading as follows:

Section 4.02. Wherein a parcel has been specially assessed by the Village and more than the assessed units are to be connected, directly or indirectly, for such excess unit or units there shall be paid to the Village at the time of issuing of sewer permit a connection charge in amount equivalent to what the excess unit or units would have been assessed in the first instance, which connection charge shall be in addition to the charges herein contained.

Section 2.01. This Ordinance shall take effect 10 days after its publication.
