State Highway Surplus Land Goes on Sale

Twelve parcels of State Highway Department surplus property valued at \$67,226 in Oakland, Macomb and St. Clair counties will be offered at a public auction sale at Mt. Clemens on Jan. 31. Eight of the parcels are in Oakland county.

The Highway Department has set minimum prices ranging from \$225 to \$30,000 on the properties. The sale will be held at 2 p.m. at the County Service Center, Health Department Building auditorium.

Mormons Pick Successor for Romney Post

Edwin B. Jones, 42, of Clawson, vice president of Michigan Bank, has been named to succeed Governor Romney as president of the Detroit Stake of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints.

Romney (of Bloomfield Hills) stepped out of the church post because his new official residence in Lansing is outside the local geographical limits.

The governor had been president of the Detroit Stake since November, 1952. He will continue to commute from Lansing for services as a member of the ward.

Jones' appointment was announced to the congregation of the Detroit Stake Ward, 425 Woodward, Bloomfield Hills, by Harold B. Lee, one of 12 Mormon Apostles from Salt Lake City.

2 Civil Defense Courses Offered At Seaholm High

The city of Birmingham and the Oakland County office of Civil Defense in cooperation with the Public Schools will offer free adult courses on disaster preparedness.

Two classes—emergency welfare and medical emergency training—are scheduled to begin next week at Seaholm High School.

Emergency welfare will cover housing, feeding, clothing and identification and registration under emergency conditions. The class will be held on Monday nights from 8 to 10 p.m. beginning Jan. 21.

Medical emergency will deal with first aid and work into advanced medical training. Classes will be conducted beginning Wed., Jan. 23 from 8 to 10 p.m.

No advance registration is necessary according to Birmingham Administrative Aide John Saeffe.

Farrell Roberts Named Chairman of Judiciary Committee

Oakland County's Republican Sen. Farrell S. Roberts has been named chairman of the Senate Judiciary Committee. He was named vice chairman of three other committees.

Rep. Henry M. Hogan, Jr., of Bloomfield Township, lost in his bid to be elected speaker pro tem of the House.
