

Orchard Lake Club Shown from the Sky

Orchard Lake Country Club started out as the dream of Willis C. Ward, who with his son, Haro'd L., donated 180 acres of land to a club corporation. The property was the site of the former Cuthbertson farm and included 200 feet of lake front. With Harold L. Ward as the first president, the newly organized club began its work. An 18-hole championship course was opened for play in 1927. A fire in 1942 destroyed the pro shop; another fire in 1961 caused \$25,000

damage to the country club's west wing, including the rebuilt pro shop. A \$140,000 remodelling program had been completed at Orchard Lake Country Club in 1951; more remodeling totaling \$200,000 followed the 1961 fire.
