**MEMORIAL CLINIC Opens Its Doors**

On January 20 from 3 to 5 p.m., the Oakland County Planned Parenthood League will hold its formal opening of the new Elizabeth Duffield Memorial Planned Parenthood Clinic located at 212 Daines St., Birmingham.

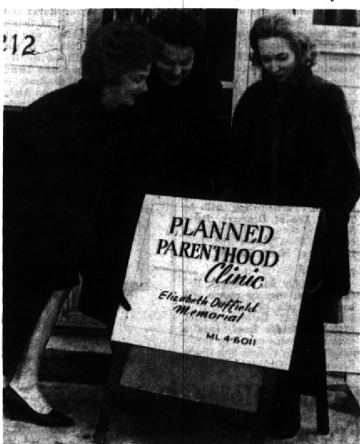
Mrs. Duffield was an active community leader and a long-time friend of Planned Parenthood and it was through her efforts that many people in the Oakland County community lent active support to the three Planned Parenthood clinics.

The new Birmingham Clinic will be the only clinic in Oakland County and will be open every day. It will offer patients pre-marital and marital counseling, cancer tests, physical examinations, information for childless couples and methods and materials for birth control.

It will also provide educational work in the community as to the need for family planning. It will provide literature on family planning and marriage and will cooperate with other social agencies as to the best social planning for a family.

Patients will be charged a fee on a sliding scale depending on income and number of children. But no one will be turned away because of inability to pay.
