**'Overture to Opera' Heralds Season**

A public "Overture to Opera," a free admission program of excerpts from the opera "Boris Godunov" and a panel discussion of the 1963 Metropolitan Opera season in Detroit, will be offered Wednesday, Jan. 23, at 8 p.m. at the Rackham Memorial building.

The program will be presented by the Education Committee of the Detroit Grand Opera Association, sponsors of the Metropolitan season, with the assistance of the University Center for Adult Education (W.S.U., U. of M., E.M.U.), and the Detroit Public Library.

Members of the Celeste Cole Opera Workshop will present highlights from Moussozsky's opera, one of the seven operas which will be offered during the 1963 season in Detroit in May.

ROY T. WILL, chairman, Department of Music, Wayne State University, will moderate the panel discussion with Mrs. Theodore O. Yntema of Bloomfield Hills, general chairman of the 1963 Metropolitan Opera Season; Celeste Cole, director of the workshop bearing her name, and

Kurt Myers, chief of the Music and Performing Arts Department of the Detroit Public Library.

The program will resemble one first presented in Detroit under similar auspices last April, but will differ in that a single opera will be highlighted and discussed. The 1962 program dealt with the entire season.

Future programs of the same type will be presented in Ferndale, Birmingham, Grosse Pointe and Dearborn approximately a month apart. Each program will be directed toward presentation

of a different opera which will be included in the 1963 season.
