Teachers See Reading Plan Demonstrated

Birmingham elementary public school teachers had an opportunity to see how to demonstrate the use of the phonovisual (phonetic) method of teaching children. A series of classroom demonstrations in kindergarten, first and second grades, and meetings with teachers were held on Monday and Tuesday at a number of elementary schools.

Mrs. Masie Lloyd, director of the Primary Day School, Bethesda, Md., and Mrs. Jane Hilder, consultant, presented the classroom demonstrations and met with teachers to discuss the phonovisual program.

The authors of the program founded the Primary Day School as a demonstration school for teaching by this method.

The phonovisual method uses pictorial charts arranged on a scientific phonetic foundation.
