Show hours are noon until 11 p.m.

IN COBO HALL Sports, Vacation Show To Open Saturday

Detroit's first Sports, Boat and Vacation show in six years opens Saturday in Cobo Hall with more than 100 exhibitors in recreation, outdoor living and resorts presenting their wares to the public. The show runs for nine days—through Sunday, Jan. 27. Hours for the show are from noon until 11 p.m. each day. Popular participation sports from archery to scuba diving will be represented. Golfers will be able to swing away at the newest scientific marvel, an electronic golf range.

BUDDING LITTLE Leaguers. Babe Ruth players, high school batsmen and fathers will have an opportunity to test their prowess in the automatic batting cages, manned by members of the March of Dimes team—Al Kalline, Vic Wertz and Charley Gehring—and a host of other professional athletes representing football, basketball and hockey. All proceeds from the two batting cages will be presented to the March of Dimes. Local and national manufacturers will display the latest models of watercraft from cruisers to canoes. Outboard motors and other boating accessories also will be shown. Mobile homes, camping trailers and all outdoor-living innovations are to be set up in the giant exhibition hall, in addition to displays by resorts and travel services telling where to go during vacation time.

Cobo Hall also will become a "Fisherman's Paradise," with lavish displays of fishing tackle and a trout pond where anglers can test their skill and fish for their dinner. The tank will be stocked with thousands of trout.

SPECIAL STAGE shows will be presented each day with Warren Covington's 14-piece band providing the music, the "Rhythm Kings" providing dancing, Paul Lennon handling comedy chores and Jan Wynn, popular vocalist, presenting her interpretations of ballads. All that's new in fishing, hunting, water skiing and other activities associated with Michigan's Water Wonderland will be shown in ballads lining the exhibit area.

Special exhibits from the United States Navy, U. S. Coast Guard and the Coast Guard Auxiliary will be shown. The show will be the first of its kind to be presented in Detroit's waterfront convention center, one of the largest in the world.

Several Birmingham area residents are expected to participate in the fourth annual Dryden Open ski meet, to be held Saturday and Sunday, at the Dryden ski area on Hough Road, 18 miles north of Rochester.

Five classes of boys and girls will compete in slalom events on Saturday, with downhill races scheduled Sunday. Plaque awards will go to the top three places in each class and registrations can be made in advance by calling Dryden ski area, or they can be made in person up to the time of the events.

State Ponders Aid To Needy Muskrats

An age-old story of wildlife dynamics is being retold in spectacular style these days in a marshy section of the Maple River state game area, located about 100 miles north of St. Johns along U.S. 27.

Woven into that story are the prolific powers of the muskrat, the pressure of an over-populated wildlife community, and the merits of multiple-use management.

DOTTED WITH dome-shaped muskrat houses easily visible to passing motorists, the game area's 200-acre wildlife flooding yielded 2,800 muskrats to trappers last season. That's an average of 14 to the acre.

A take of three to four muskrats per acre is considered good in most parts of the state.

Last season's harvest was an outstanding end product of stabilized water levels and good food supplies which encouraged the big build-up of rats. Things have changed since then.
