Hills to Set Up Class For Gifted Youngsters

A special class for children who show both near-genius I.Q. and an extremely high level of achievement met with approval of Bloomfield Hills School Board members at their meeting Tuesday night.

The proposal was outlined to the board by assistant superintendent of schools, Kay Flint.

Other board action included approval to purchase an elementary school site on Franklin and an advance of next year's library allotment to Booth and East Hills Junior High School.

MRS. FLINT told the board that the special class would be set up on an experimental basis. A teacher qualified to teach the exceptionally-advanced child would be in charge of the ungraded classroom. The class would consist of from 10 to 14 children of elementary grade age who have abilities far beyond their normal age grade level.

"The class would not be for the very 'bright child'—whom we all have many—but for the near-genius student who has demonstrated achievement at that level," Mrs. Flint told the board. She cited as an example a present kindergarten-ager who is reading at fourth-grade level.

Police Discover Fire in Franklin Doctor's House

The police and fire departments of three area communities played a part in fighting a Franklin fire last week in which a physician and seven members of his family escaped safely.

Beverly Hills Patrolmen James Davis and Gregory Putnam discovered flames pouring out of a workshop attached to the home of Dr. John H. Burger, 32055 Telegraph road, at about 6 a.m. Jan. 17. The two patrolmen, who had been chasing a speeding motorist, woke the family and called Franklin firemen.

A PART of the Bloomfield Township fire department left a fire at the home of Harry Richardson in the township, which they had been fighting, to assist the Franklin department. Damage was estimated at between \$10,000 and \$12,000 and was confined to the workshop containing power tools and antiques. Firemen believe the fire started in a defective oil space heater.
