

League Urges Support for Constitution

Michigan Municipal League President William C. Kirby has announced the initiation of a campaign to urge the support of the new proposed constitution by League member municipalities.
 President Kirby disclosed that the Board of Trustees of the Michigan Municipal League at its regular January meeting agreed to work with all other interested groups in carrying out a program to win the approval of the electors and to establish an action program of furnishing municipal officials with information on the proposed new constitution.
 This reaffirms the league's resolution passed by the membership at its annual convention in Detroit, Sept. 20.
 The resolution supported the new constitution and called upon the league member cities and villages to urge their citizens to vote


"yes" on the question of approving the new constitution upon its submission to the people.
 "IN FURTHERANCE of the league's position, effective action must be taken primarily by the membership," stated President Kirby.
 "Mayors and councilmen are in a particularly strategic position to spearhead a campaign for acceptance of the new constitution. We have an obligation, whatever our personal opinion may be, to make its contents known to the people, so that they in turn may fulfill their obligation as an informed electorate."
 The league support on the proposed constitution was given after months of careful study by a special Con-Con Committee. The League believes that the constitution represents a substantial step forward toward more efficient government.
