

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 38 be and the same hereby is amended by the addition of a new sub-section to be known as Sub-Section 4.02 reading as follows:

Section 4.02. Twelve Town Relief Drain and Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2 Debt Service Charge.

4.02 (a). The term "Twelve Town Relief Drain" and "Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2" shall be construed to mean the "Twelve Town Relief Drain" and "Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2" acquired and constructed by Oakland County pursuant to contract with the Village.

(b). In addition to any consumption or other charge, each premises connected or connecting directly or indi-rectly to the Twelve Town Relief Drain shall pay a debt service charge as hereinafter provided.

service charge as hereinafter provided.

(c). Existing developed premises shall pay a debt service charge of \$1,229.47 on or before March 15, 1963. As an alternative, such connection charge may be paid on existing developed premises over a period not exceeding 30 years in the amount of \$1,455.00. In the event that the owner of such premises elects to make payment over a period of 30 years, the first payment therein shall be made on or before March 15, 1963, and on the same day and month of each year thereafter in the amount of \$48.50 for each annual payment over the 30 year period. Any premises not presently developed, shall at the time permit is taken out for development, pay debt service charge of \$1,455.00 by paying the Village in cash an amount equal to the number of years times \$48.50 elapsed since March 15, 1963, and then on the next following March 1st and on the same day and month of each year thereafter shall pay the sum of \$48.50 until the year 1992. Such debt service charge of \$1,455.00 may be paid in cash at the time the permit is taken out.

(e). Once any premises not presently developed shall have satisfied the requirements of paragraph (d) hereof, the owner thereof shall have the same option of pre-pay-ment as set forth in paragraph (c) hereof.

(f). A penalty of 10% of the payment shall be added to any payment not paid by the due date thereof.

There shall be established and maintained a separate depository account designated as the Twelve Town Relief Drain and Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2 Contract Payment Fund (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Payment Fund (hereinafter referred to as "Contract Payment Fund"), the monies on deposit therein from time to time to be used solely for the purpose of paying the contractual payment required to be paid by the Village to the County in connection with a certain contract between the County and the Village and certain other municipalities entered into for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and financing the Twelve Town Relief Drain and Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2. There shall be deposited in said Contract Payment Fund at Pund at the time that said monies are collected. Money shall be transferred from the Contract Payment Fund at the time that said monies are collected. Money shall be transferred from the Contract Payment Fund at contracting payments required to be paid by the Village to the County in connection with said Twelve Town Relief Drain and Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2. Monies in such fund may be invested in obligations of the United States of America, with maturity so scheduled as to make available to the Village monies required to meet its obligation to the County under said contract.

(h). Except as changed by the provisions of this sub-section, all the provisions of Ordinance No. 38 shall apply to the Twelve Town Relief Drain and Enclosure of Red Run Drain No. 2.

Section 2.02. This Ordinance shall take effect 10 days following its publication.
