

County Auditors Reply To Farnum Charges

The Oakland County Board of Auditors has sent an official reply to Aud. Gen. Billie S. Farnum in answer to his pre-election charges that county officials had been over paid by more than \$11,000.

The board told Farnum in a letter that some of the disputed funds would be repaid though they denied that anything illegal had been done.

The auditors said that Delos Hamlin, chairman of the board of supervisors, had agreed to give up \$25 per year as a member of the county drain board and would reimburse the county for notices received for attending drain board meetings over the last three years. Hamlin had previously described charges that he sought extra pay as "ridiculous." He is a well-to-do businessman.

THE BOARD ALSO agreed to discontinue the practice of advancing expenses for travel by county employees when on county business. The county had paid its officials within the limits of legal discretionary power, the report said. The letter also accused Farnum of exceeding his authority and said the auditor general had "overstepped himself to the 'direction' of any other agency, including the auditor general."

THE LETTER SAID that the auditor general had "made it difficult for this board and other county agencies to act expeditiously in the adoption of any meritorious ideas which might be contained in his report without implying reproach to the right of the auditor general to do so 'direct'."

The auditors denied Farnum's stand that some supervisors were illegally getting double pay and that excess car and expenses allowances were being paid to some county officials.

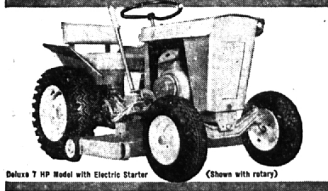
