

Bonds Sold More Than \$10,000,000

Oakland County residents invested \$10,041,855 in series E and H United States savings bonds during 1962, it was announced today by Alfred C. Girard, chairman of the Oakland County Savings Bond Committee.

The 1962 total represented 85.2 per cent of the county's Treasury-assigned goal for the year. The 1961 figure was \$10,303,730. In announcing the 1962 figures,

the county bond chairman said he hoped for a substantial increase in purchases during the current year.

HE SAID THE TREASURY is looking for a large volume of new business from taxpayers who choose to take refunds due on their 1962 income tax in the form of savings bonds, instead of checks. The option was made available for the first time this year.

"The Treasury also is making a strong appeal for every American family to buy at least one savings bond before July 4, 1963," he pointed out.

"Organizations and clubs of all kinds are being encouraged to get behind this effort. Members will be asked to take part in the drive, and if 50 per cent of them buy at least one bond, the organization will qualify for a Treasury citation."

Industrial Employees Take Health Tests

Selected employee groups in Oakland County will be given multiple screening tests for a three week period beginning Monday.

Industrial employees in Troy, Madison Heights, Clawson, Ferndale, Oak Park and Hazel Park will take the tests. The tests will also be given to about 300 of Pontiac's postal employees on Tuesday.

The purpose of the tests is to demonstrate the effectiveness of multiple screening tests for finding unrecognized diseases.

INFORMATION GAINED by the tests will be helpful to physicians in spotting chronic illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, lung cancer, kidney disease, syphilis and tuberculosis.

Body conditions such as high or low blood pressure, anemia, underweight and obesity can also be checked.

"Chronic disease is one of our biggest public health problems," said Dr. Frank J. Condon, deputy director of the Oakland County Department of Health.

According to the National Health Survey we can expect over 10 per cent of our citizens to have chronic diseases which will in some way limit their activity. And this

Tax Bureau Offers Special Help Mondays

The Detroit district office of the Internal Revenue Service has announced plans for assisting taxpayers in preparing their 1962 Federal income tax returns.

Most of your tax questions can be answered by phone, District Director Nixon of the Internal Revenue Service says. Telephone service has been expanded this year to assist taxpayers Monday through Friday in completing their returns.

In addition, the various Internal Revenue offices will designate Monday as Special Assistance Day. Internal Revenue personnel will be available each Monday through April 15 so that taxpayers visiting the offices on that day may have their questions answered.

REVIEW OF early-filed Federal tax returns in the Detroit District reveals that some taxpayers are failing to fill in all required data, according to Nixon.

He says individual and business taxpayers particularly should carry forward to proper lines on the face of the return data from any attached schedules.

Nixon also calls attention to the legal requirement effective this year that taxpayers enter their tax account identifying numbers on returns. For the individual, this is his Social Security number or a similar number assigned for tax purposes.

Director Nixon says his office will supply application forms for anyone's still needing numbers. This also applies to business taxpayers who must enter their Employer Identification Number on their returns.

figure does not include persons institutionalized in hospitals, nursing and boarding homes, etc."

SINCE 1960, when the program began, over 8,000 persons have been screened in Oakland County. Thirty-three per cent had suspected abnormalities and sixty-two per cent of these were confirmed. About two-thirds of the confirmed findings were previously unknown.

"The fact is that many of these ailments can be cured or minimized if they are found early," stressed Dr. Condon.

The tests which include chest X-ray, urinalysis, blood pressure measurement, height and weight check, and blood specimens will be given at the place of employment and are free. All findings are recorded and will be handled confidentially.

ALL PARTICIPANTS in the survey will be notified by mail of the test results. Reports of abnormal findings will be forwarded to the participant's physician for further study.

Dr. Condon emphasized that while the tests are a valuable tool in finding chronic diseases, they do not take the place of a physical examination.

Only a thorough physical examination by your physician can give assurance that you have no health problems, he said.

The Oakland County Medical Society, Oakland County Dept. of Health and the Michigan Department of Health are jointly sponsoring the program.
