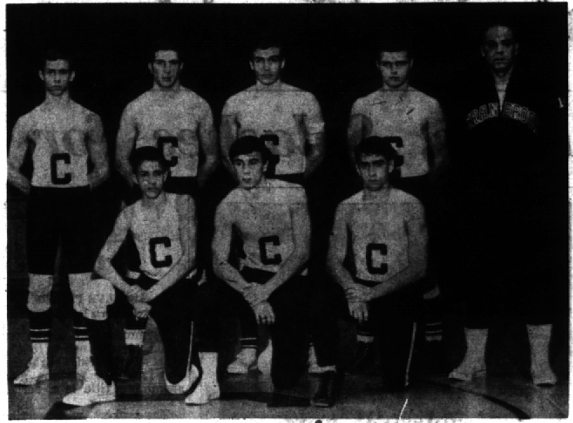
College Grappler Is Cranbrook Grad

Last Friday's (Jan. 25) meeting in the activities room of the Community House was well attended by these retired men in spite of the unusually cold weather.

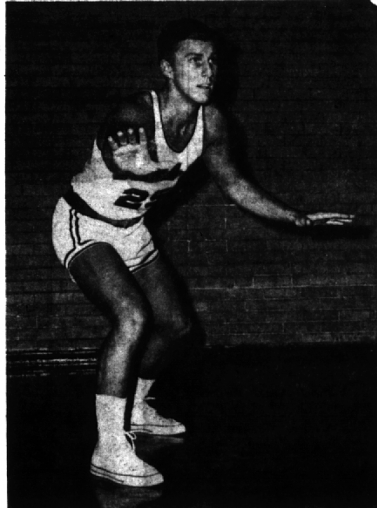

- No. 1—If you HAVE BEEN feeding them regularly keep it up. It is a mean trick to suddenly present them with NOTHING. Some birds must eat every 15 minutes all day to be able to survive the long night hours.
- If you are going away we will be glad to see that some seed is provided at regular intervals until you return.
- No. 2—The use of a small electric WATER HEATER to keep the drinking water unfrozen will act as a clarion call to many of the beauties which choose to spend the winter with us.
- No. 3—The Trail Blazer's Almanac states with assurance that the 29th, 30th, and 31st of January will be "clear, then rain or snow." This indicates without quibbling that each home should have on hand a supply of:—
 - X-2 (for melting snow and ice)
 - SALT (for melting snow and ice)
 - CALCIUM CHLORIDE (for melting snow and ice)
 - CAR-GO (for getting car out of trouble)
 - SNOW SHOVELS (for shoveling snow)
 - SNOW PUSHERS (for pushing snow)
 - CANNEL COAL (for fireplace grates—o.k.)
 - FIRE QUETS (for fireplace grates—excellent)
 - FIRE GEMS (for fireplace grates—good)
 - KINDLE-LITE LOGS (for starting the above three)
 - DOG TEX (for dog and kitty carpet spots)
- No. 4—Stop the newsboy and everyone from beating a regular path across the lawn—otherwise, the beaten path may be beyond repair in the spring. (If they use snow shoes, don't worry.)
