Recipe of the week: Roast Lamb with Rosemary, leg of lamb, 2 T. olive oil, 1 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. pepper, 2 cloves garlic, 1/2 cup flour, 1/2 tsp. dried rosemary, 1 tsp. salt, 1/2 cup butter, 1/2 cup white wine, 1/2 cup dry white wine, 1/2 cup red wine, 1/2 cup port wine. Make a paste of flour, rosemary, and salt. Pour over roast and roast 1 hr. 30 min. in hot oven. Turn over roast and baste frequently. Allow 30 min. to the lb.


