Township Bank Robber Receives Stiff Jail Term

A man who robbed the Manufacturers National Bank at W. Maple and Telegraph, Bloomfield Township, last March 19 has been sentenced to 20 years in a Federal Prison.

Allan E. Morrison, 29, of Oak Park, was ordered to spend the first 90 days of his sentence in a psychiatric hospital by Federal Judge Wade H. McCree to help the judge determine if the sentence should be reduced.

A jury had already been selected to try Morrison Monday when his attorney Joseph W. Louisell stopped the proceedings so his client could plead guilty to the township robbery. He later pled guilty to robbing three other banks in the metropolitan area.

HE TOLD U. S. Attorney Sanford Rosenthal the Bloomfield robbery netted him \$3,173. The other robberies totaled about \$5,000, Rosenthal said.

Married and the father of two children, Morrison has been free on bond since his arrest last spring. He told police he had used the money obtained in the robberies to cover gambling losses.



Romney on Taxes

The governor has been on a two-week trip, with four or five stops scheduled each day throughout Michigan for discussion of state taxes. Main opposition to Romney's tax proposals centered on the provision to defer senior citizens' property taxes until after disposal of their property.

S'field Officials Win Dismissal Of Circuit Suit

The suit against seven Southfield officials and a former councilman, charged with illegally spending city money, has been dismissed in Oakland County Circuit Court.

James E. Wells, an unsuccessful candidate for the council in April, asked in the suit to have the court order the seven to repay \$3,431 to the city.

THE SUIT charged "expense charges against the city for entertainment, travel and related expenses in connection with conventions of city officials contained illegal and excessive charges, which were wrongfully ordered paid by City Administrator Donald V. Smith."

Circuit Judge Stanton G. Dondero dismissed the suit Monday, ruling that Wells presented no evidence to substantiate the charges.

Landino Reminds Residents About Danger of Fire

"If you have any doubts as to escape routes in your home your fire department will be more than happy to assist you.

"Let us all work together and keep our community fire safe."
