

New Youth Director Joins 1st Presbyterian

Dr. W. Glen Harris, pastor of Birmingham's First Presbyterian Church, announces that William D. Cecil has assumed responsibilities as director of the youth program at the church.

Cecil has had experience in Christian nurture with families, children, youth and adults; from public school to church, he has maintained active leadership with junior high and senior high young people.

HE HAS GIVEN attention to church school administration in the youth division, drama and the speech arts, to vocational guidance and personal counseling and to senior high camps and conferences. His leadership has been given in Presbytery and Synod Christian Education projects and in community endeavors.

CECIL COMES from Alliance, Ohio, having served the First Presbyterian Church there as director of Christian Education since 1956.

He previously occupied a similar position in Central Presbyterian Church, Buffalo, N. Y. (one of the largest Protestant churches in western New York), and at the historic Market Square Presbyterian Church, Harrisburg, Pa.

For 15 years prior to 1946, he was a public school teacher and curriculum coordinator in Forest Hills, Pittsburgh, Pa.

Cecil was educated in the Conellville, Pa., public schools, attended Park College (Presbyterian Affiliated) and graduated from the School of Education, University of Michigan in 1951. His graduate work has extended in continuing education at the University of Pittsburgh, Penn State University and at Western Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh.

Mrs. Cecil holds degrees in education from the University of Pittsburgh. The couple has three children, Carolyn, a high school sophomore; Deborah, a seventh grader; and Billy, a second grader. They will reside at 551 Chester, Birmingham.
