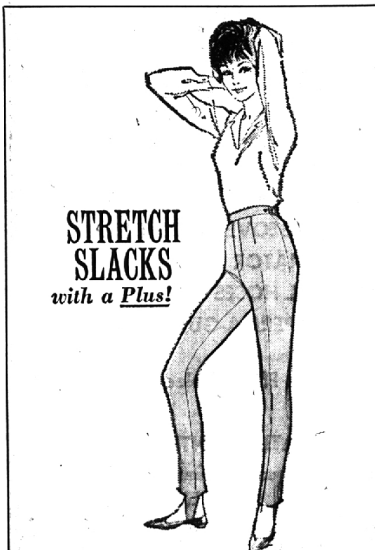
## Oakland Hills Div. Busy in Campaign For Torch Drive

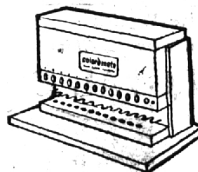

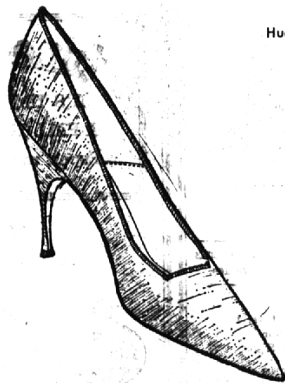

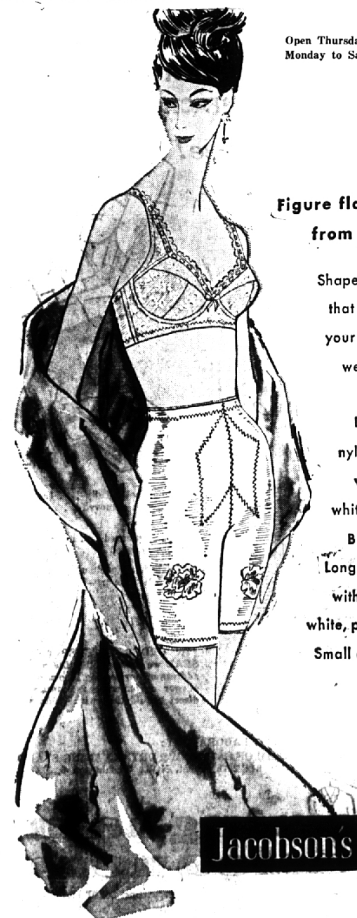
