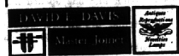

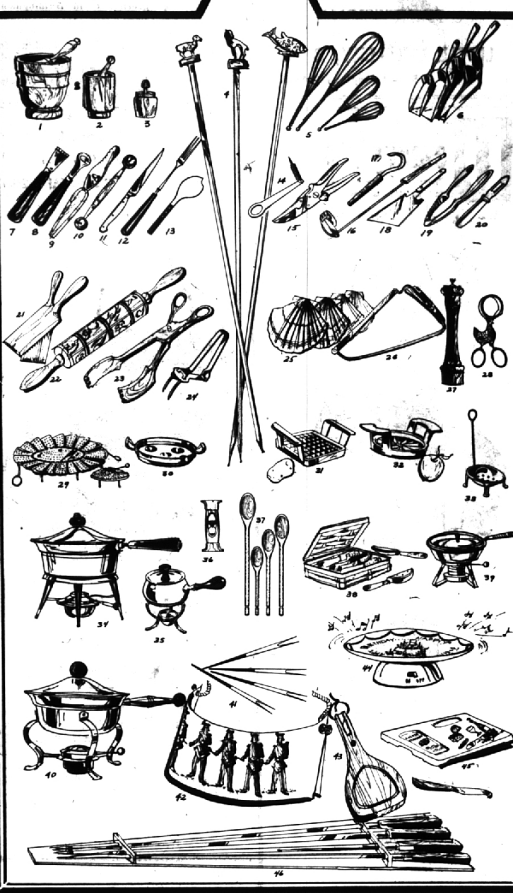
Potter-Ferguson Marriage Rites Read in Germany
