OU Selects Director of New Program

Dr. Russell E. Elliott was appointed Director of Professional Development Programs in the Division of Continuing Education, Oakland University, effective Oct. 1, according to an announcement by Dr. Lowell Eklund, associate dean of the University for Continuing Education.

In the newly created post, Elliott will be responsible for developing conferences, seminars, evening courses and other programs for the business and industrial community in the Oakland area.

HE RECEIVED his Ph.D. from Wayne State University in speech and management and is a graduate of the University of Illinois school of journalism.

He has had 31 years of experience as a newspaper man and public relations consultant, including being general manager of three daily newspapers and advertising manager of one.

HE HAS ALSO served as public relations director for the Detroit Council of Churches and conducted public relations and communications clinics for the Flint United Foundation, for National YMCA

Conferences and for the advertising department of the Detroit Free Press.

"Over 60 per cent of the 2,410 students enrolled in the Division of Continuing Education last year were attending job-related courses," according to Eklund. "Dr. Elliott's appointment will give the Division a qualified staff member to work closely with local business and industry in designing professional development programs of the post-graduate, non-credit nature for which demand is on the increase."

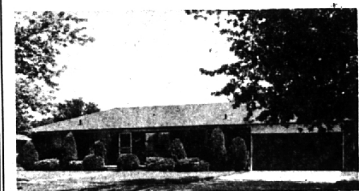

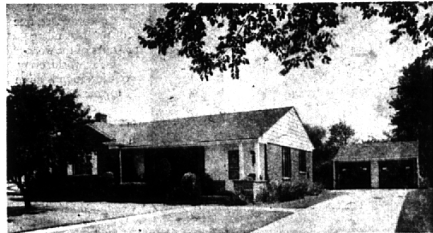
