

B'ham Man Appointed To Membership Post

Andrew Aljian of Birmingham has been named as Michigan membership chairman of the National Society for the Prevention of Juvenile Delinquency. The appointment was made by Flavius N. Costerella, chairman of the board and an assistant attorney general for New York State.

In his position, Aljian, a life insurance counselor for New England Mutual Life Insurance Co. will be responsible for enlisting individual and group support for the national delinquency prevention organization. A major objective of his administrative function is to establish a State Chapter of citizens concerned with the state's delinquency increase, Costerella said.

IN MAKING THE appointment, Costerella noted: "Mr. Aljian is the type of concerned citizen whose successful business accomplishments reflect his organizational and personal ability. We are confident that he will be a splendid example for those who have given some thought to the matter of fighting delinquency."
