**Registered Nurse Appointed to Post With Diaper Firm**

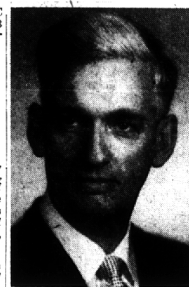

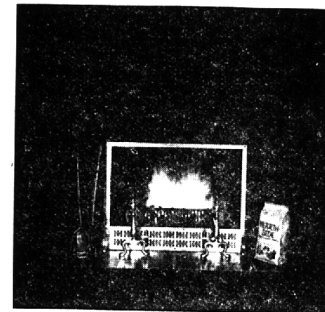

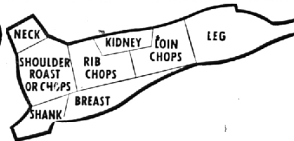
