The new continuing Michigan Conference of Congregational Churches of Birmingham was represented by Mr. and Mrs. Carl Nielsen and the Rev. and Mrs. Howard Bull. Members of Pilgrim elected to office in the state organization were: Rev. Bull, vice moderator; Venen D. Johnson, chairman of the Men's Work Committee; James N. Isham to the Church and Pastoral Relations Committee; and James K. Flack, chairman of the Nominating Committee. Thomas D. Stafford of the Mayflower Church is the new moderator.

IN A HISTORY-MAKING session, the delegates adopted a resolution to alter the name of the state organization from the Michigan Association to the Congregational Christian Churches, perpetuating a 122-year-old fellowship of Congregationalism. The new continuing Michigan Conference is presently composed of some 40 Congregational churches which chose not to merge into the United Church of Christ, and plans are now being made for the 123rd annual meeting of the Michigan Conference of Congregational Christian Churches to be held in Royal Oak next October.

### Church Youth To Ask Funds For Children

Three hundred young people from Birmingham churches will cooperate with the life-saving work of UNICEF, the United Nations Children's Fund, between 5 and 7 p.m. Sunday—the Sunday night prior to Halloween. Under the auspices of Birmingham Council of Churches, youth groups will go from door-to-door with adult supervision to accept pennies for the Children's Fund. These good-will ambassadors will be identified by their official collection carton, a half-pint milk container printed in orange and black with the UNICEF symbol of the mother and child. The cartons were made available locally through the Birmingham YMCA.

LATER IN THE evening, the "trick or treat" will be counted at a Halloween Fellowship Time from 7 to 8 p.m. at the First Methodist Church, 300 Willis. This will include a dedication service and a movie featuring Danny Kaye. Last fall more than \$12,000 was raised in Birmingham and more than \$2 million was thus raised by some three and one-half million American youngsters in about 12,000 communities. Each dollar contributed to UNICEF can mean a daily glass of milk for 17 hungry children for a whole month, said the Rev. William W. Sutterlin, publicity chairman of the First Baptist Church.

### The Birmingham Eccentric Church Have Religion Workshop Announces Program

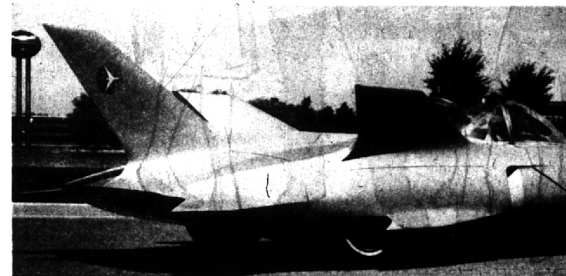
