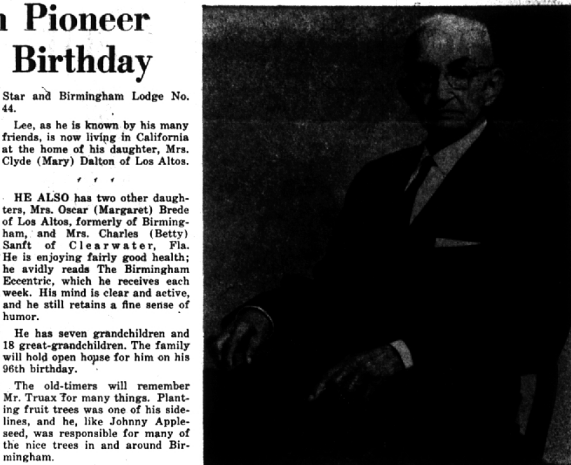

He and the late Wylie Bell always competed to see who would be the one to wear the first straw hat in town every summer.

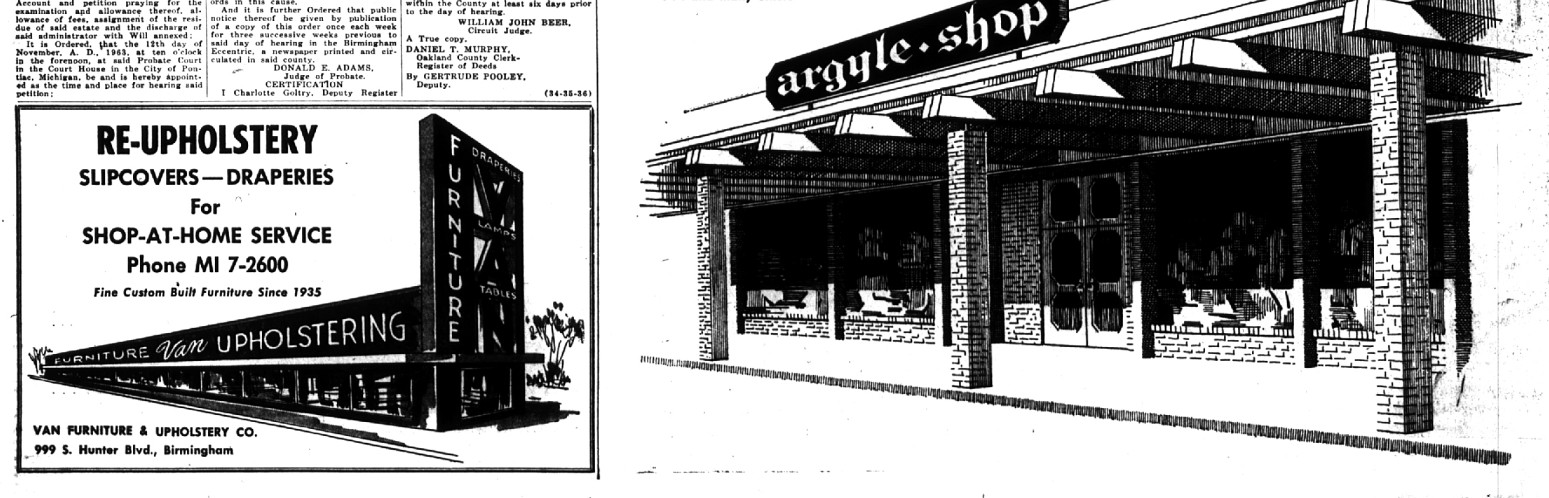
