

Steel Jewelry Marked By Elegance, Utility

The exhibition of stainless steel jewelry by Mary Ann Scherr, being shown at America House — Michigan through Oct. 26, is a significant demonstration of imaginative craftsmanship. Mrs. Scherr is currently teaching Jewelry Design at the Akron Art Institute. She has taught Jewelry Design in Seoul, Korea, at the request of the International Cooperation Administration. Her husband, Samuel Scherr, is an eminent designer with the Scherr-McDermott Industrial Design firm.

Mrs. Scherr does not fall into the ill-conceived trap of conceiving jewelry to be sculpture scaled down to human neck, wrist, finger and ear sizes.

She is constantly aware of the need for elegant complement. Her good taste is further confirmed in that she does not confuse jewelry with weaponry. The collection does not contain any examples of two pound pendants, single finger brass knuckles, or the inevitable lumberman's pea a very quantity equipped with a pin back.

IF ELEGANCE and utility constitute the ultimate purpose of the creative jeweler—Mrs. Scherr has admirably achieved her mission.

Englishman Gives Talk On Ceramics

John Cushman, an authority on ceramics from the Victoria and Albert Museum, London, England, will speak at the Village Woman's Club at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday.

The lecture is open to the public. He will talk about the major English porcelain factories such as Bow, Derby, Chelsea and Worcester, with particular emphasis on identification.

CUSHION IS A research assistant in the ceramic department of the Museum. In this country he would be called a curator. He is an authority on "markings" and has written three books on ceramics.

For three years he has been a tutor at the Attitash Park Summer School. This is an annual three weeks school attended by about 45 American collectors and students. The three weeks are spent visiting historic houses and hearing lectures on architecture, furniture, textiles, etc. Cushman acts as guide and lecturer for these sessions.
