

Artist, Sculptor Give Lecture At St. Mary's

An artist and a sculptor, both members of the faculty of the Cleveland Institute of Art, were the main speakers Sunday at the first "Essai" or formal lecture of the academic year sponsored by the Agunias Academy of St. Mary's College, Orchard Lake. Joseph Jankowski, the artist, and Carl van Duser, the sculptor, delivered a formal talk followed by a question and answer period in the campus assembly hall. The lecture began at 7:30 p.m.

AS BOTH MEN spoke, they stood in the shadow of a 25-foot, one-ton copper Madonna suspended from the facade of the newly built Shrine Chapel of Our Lady of Orchard Lake on the campus. Both men played important roles in the execution of the figure. Jankowski designed it and van Duser formed it in copper. It is one of the largest hand-executed works of copper in the U. S. It took a year to make and was set in place last November.

The International Institute in Detroit will stage its annual "Old World Market" from noon to 10 p.m. Nov. 21 through 24.

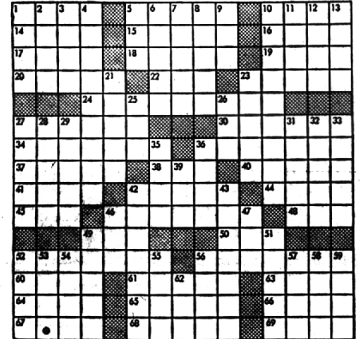
linens and handmade lace to hand-carved toys, Christmas cards in several languages, and etched silver. Decorations for this year's market will be nautical — ships,

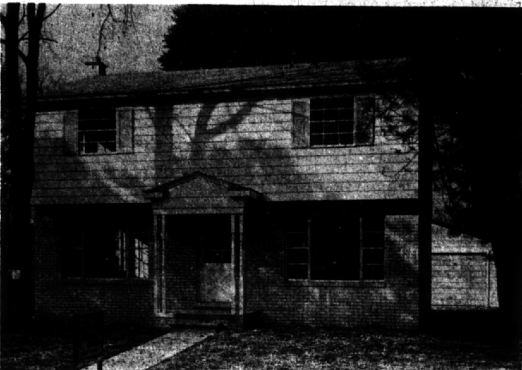

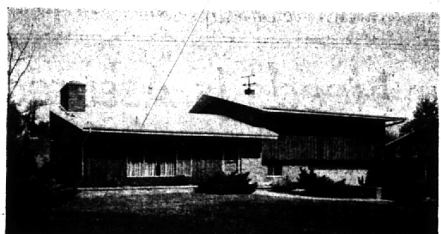
