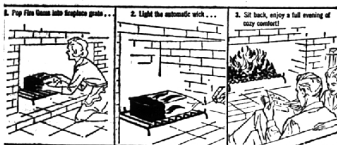

A three-hour ski-jumping tournament will be held at Farwell Field, adjacent to the Armory, on a special 128-foot high and 330-foot long steel scaffold now under construction.

For the first time, jumpers will take off from an artificial plastic surface instead of snow or ice and they will land on shaved ice. The tournament will be held on Nov. 9 and 10.

INVITATIONS to compete in the tournament have been extended to the U.S. Olympic Jumping Squad, the Canadian Squad, European teams, plus 15 Michigan and out-of-state jumping clubs.

All proceeds will be donated to the U. S. Ski Team Funds to aid the U.S. Olympic teams competing in the 1964 Winter Olympics and to assist the U. S. Training Camps for future Olympics.

BRONCOS ROLL, 39-6

Holly Hands B'field 5th Wayne-Oakland Loss

Holly struck for two quick touchdowns against Bloomfield Hills Friday and remained in control the rest of the game, defeating the Barons, 39-6.

It marked the fifth loss for Bloomfield, last year's co-champs of the Wayne-Oakland circuit, and the Barons now are 1-5, a game ahead of last-place Clarenceville.

Bloomfield coach Don Hoff simply has not got the material he had in last year's winners. The small Barons line cannot open holes for Bloomfield runners, and worse yet, has trouble stopping opponents from scoring.

HOLLY'S MARK Phalen dashed 30 yards for a TD on the second play from scrimmage in the game for the visitors. Perry Lieb converted and Holly led, 7-0, at the 9:19 mark of the opening period.

Holly then capitalized on an on-side kick when a Barons lineman walked away from the ball, and drove in to score again. Jerry McMillan pounded out several gains and Jim Starr went two yards for the TD. The Barons had a 1-0 lead in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, McMillan went five yards around right end and Lieb's third conversion made it 21-0.

BLOOMFIELD got on the scoreboard with 40 seconds left in the first half when quarterback Jamie Miller completed several passes to end Dave Robillard.

Miller then found Robillard open on the five and hit the Baron end for the TD with a short toss. That made it 21-6 at half.

But Bloomfield could never narrow the gap. A second half touchdown by McMillan made it 27-6, and in the closing minutes of action, Gary Thrall intercepted a pass and scampered 44 yards to score to add to Phalen's second TD. Bloomfield now travels to West Bloomfield to close out the season. Coach Hoff hopes it's on a happy note.

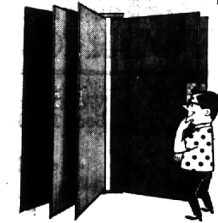
