BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 84

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 67 KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE.

The Township of Bloomfield Ordains:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 67 known as the Zoning Ordinance be and the same hereby is amended by adding to Section 1000, subsection 4, as follows:

A further expansion of subsection 4 of Section 1000. Principal Uses Permitted, Research Park District.

Section 1000.

4. Hospitals, clinics, and recreation uses when developed as a use accessory to the principal use. In those instances wherein a parcel of land within a Research Park District has a common boundary with a Residential District, a church, hospital, clinic, convalescent home and/or office uses not incident to the research use, shall be permitted on said parcel within the Research Park District so as to serve as a further transition with the abutting Residential District, and shall be subject to the standards set forth for these uses, in Section 401, 501, subsections 2 and 3, Section 500, and Section 1300 of this Ordinance.

Section 2.01. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby given immediate effect pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 and Section 14 of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 as amended.

Made and passed by the Township Board of Bloomfield Township, Oakland County, Michigan, on the 28th day of October, 1963.

At the same time, Max B. Ross was appointed sales manager, succeeding Thompson. The appointments were announced by Robert W. Englehart, corporate vice president.

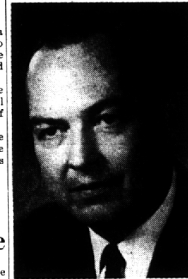

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 85

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE #67, BEING THE ZONING ORDINANCE.

The Township of Bloomfield Ordains:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance Number 67 known as the Zoning Ordinance be and the same hereby is amended by amending Subsection (L) of Section 1300 and by adding Subsection 7 to Section 1410, Fence Controls, re: 6 foot high fence and Board of Appeals approval.

SECTION 1300

(L) A six (6) foot obscuring wall or fence, measured from the surface of the ground, or a twenty (20) foot greenbelt shall be provided on those sides of the property abutting land zoned for residential use. The greenbelt planting plan shall be reviewed and approved by the Board of Appeals in conformity with the requirements of SECTION 1409. The Board of Appeals, upon application by the property owner of the parcel to be developed, or by request of abutting property owners, may modify the height requirements, where in unusual circumstances no good purposes would be served by compliance with the requirement of a six (6) foot wall or fence. In no instance shall a wall be permitted to be less than four (4) feet in height, measured from the surface of the ground.

SECTION 1410

(7) The Board of Appeals may, upon application by the property owner, modify the height of the fence which is intended to enclose property, and it is within a required yard, subject to the following conditions, to-wit:

(a) The heights shall in no instance exceed six (6) feet, measured from the surface of the ground.

(b) The modification shall not obstruct the light and air of any neighboring residence.

(c) The modified fence shall not be built in any side yard (see definition 4-j (3)).


(d) The modified fence shall be required to offer privacy in swimming pool, patio, terrace and similar private areas.

(3) The Board of Appeals shall be furnished with photographs clearly portraying the area to be fenced, as well as the abutting properties affected.

Section 2.01. The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby given immediate effect pursuant to the provisions of Section 11 and Section 14 of Act 184 of the Public Acts of 1943 as amended.
