

Food Supervisor Will Give Speech In Atlantic City

Lois McLeod, food service supervisor of the Detroit Country Day School, Birmingham, will be a featured speaker at the 17th annual convention of the American School Food Service Association Oct. 29-Nov. 2 in Atlantic City, N. J.

Miss McLeod will discuss school food service programs in London, England, during a meeting titled "European School Lunches As We Saw Them."

She was a member of an ASFSFA-sponsored tour of school food service facilities in Europe last fall, and her report will be based on a first-hand examination of the London County school food service program.

Naturalists Are Ready for School Talks

Thousands of youngsters will get tips on how to discover nature's wonders when the 1968-69 school lecture series provided by naturalists of the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority begins its annual five-month program starting Friday.

Some of the creatures the boys and girls will be learning about include the marsh bird called "The Least Bittern," the great horned owl and the saucy red squirrel. Through illustrated slides and film, they will also learn about forests, marshes, animals, birds, insects and rocks.

William F. Hopkins, chief naturalist, pointed out that authority naturalists are available to give lectures on topics of natural science at schools in the counties of Livingston, Macomb, Oakland, Washtenaw and Wayne from Friday through March 31, 1964.

MORE THAN 65,000 youngsters in the five-county area participated in the lecture program last year compared to over 41,000 in 1961-62, 39,000 in 1960-61 and 17,000 in 1959-60.

This free service may be obtained by contacting the Huron-Clinton Metropolitan Authority, 1760 Guardian Building, Detroit, and requesting an application form. Appointments require several weeks advance notice and each school can be visited only one day each year. The naturalists prefer to talk to auditorium groups but can provide up to four lectures on a single day if a divided student body is necessary.

Most lectures are designed for boys and girls in grade 3 through 12 and cover 45 minutes, but 30-minute programs are also available for youngsters in the kindergarten, first and second grades. Wildlife and Michigan natural resources are stressed and many photographs were taken at Kensington Metropolitan Park southeast of Brighton. Traveling the lecture trail this season are Huron-Clinton naturalists William F. Hopkins and Richard A. Mortemore.
