## Two Hurt As Ditch Caves In

THE ACCIDENT occurred at 2 p.m. Monday as the men were working on the installation of a water main on Squirrel Road, just south of Square Lake Road, Bloomfield Township.

Smith and Rogers were working in the eight feet deep, four feet wide trench—along with a third man, Arthur J. Kazzyk, 28, of East Detroit—when the sides gave way, toppling the truck into the ditch, upside-down, trapping the men under a mound of dirt.

Fellow workers dug the men out. Kazzyk, buried up to his thighs, was not seriously injured and continued working.

Two men were injured, one seriously, when the ditch in which they were working caved in causing a dump truck, parked at the ditch's edge, to overturn upon them.
