

Charlotte Ford to Speak On Juvenile Delinquency

A group of top civic leaders concerned with the problem of juvenile delinquency will host a luncheon Monday in Detroit where two top officials of the National Society for the Prevention of Juvenile Delinquency will be the guest speakers.

Most of those in attendance will be from the Birmingham-Bloomfield area. Included are many members of the Citizens Council for Youth Physical Fitness. Mrs. William A. Compton of the Birmingham Citizens Council group is general chairman for the delinquency discussion luncheon.

The group of about 50 persons will meet at the Detroit Athletic Club where they will hear reports on what community activity can be implemented as a combative against the soaring youth crime rate. Heading the speaking group is Charlotte Ford, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Ford II, who is youth activities director of the national society.

Another former Detroit, John R. Winter, the national society's executive director, will give the keynote address about the total scope of the organization's program. Winter, formerly a member of the public relations staff of Chrysler Corp., has had a direct hand in revitalizing the national society's program.

The 10 year old organization has been registered with the New York Social Welfare Department and the U. S. Treasury Department as a non-profit, charitable group.
