CERTIFICATION
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Enrollments Reach Peak For B'ham Summer School

Record high enrollments again were reached in the 1968 summer school program of the Birmingham Public Schools. This year, 62.3 percent of the students were enrolled in enrichment and advanced courses, and 37.7 percent were taking make-up work. Eleven colleges were represented by 31 students taking summer school courses.

Delaware was the first state to ratify the U.S. Constitution. Rhode Island and North Carolina refused to take part in the new government until the first Congress had begun to adopt a bill of rights.

Each year students request a greater variety of courses to help them keep up with increased educational needs, according to Daniel Keightley, deputy superintendent. The current trend of offering advanced and enrichment courses continues to grow, although students have the opportunity to make up work.

THIS SUMMER school serves a threefold purpose, offering the student the opportunity for remedial work, e.g., reading, mathematics; enrichment courses which the student may take at an earlier time vs. regular school year; and courses not offered during the regular school year.

James Liddell, principal, Bloomfield Village Elementary School, was director of the elementary summer program in which 33 teachers participated.

This year 10 percent of the students were enrolled in enrichment courses, a 10 percent increase over 1967. Remedial reading enrollment totaled 208 students, an increase of three students. Students who attend non-public schools represented 10 percent of the enrollment.

THE FOLLOWING is a breakdown of elementary enrollment: remedial reading, 208; arithmetic, 163; art, 9; enriched reading, 28; personal fitness, 194; speech correction, 30; typing, 50.
