She received an award from St. Cyprian's Episcopal Church in September for outstanding work in pioneering better racial relations.

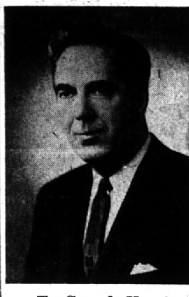
She is an associate professor, holds a bachelor of arts degree from Oberlin College and a master of social work degree from the University of Michigan.

Family Moves to B'ham Area After Reading The Eccentric

How The Birmingham Eccentric helped her Montclair, N. J., family find a new home in Bloomfield Hills was related by Mrs. Kai Gulve, 4450 Echo Road, last week.

"The mother of four children who are now attending Bloomfield Hills school, Mrs. Gulve said the family planned a move when her husband was offered a general agency with Lincoln National Life Insurance recently. Several locations, including the Detroit area, were chosen.

"The first thing I asked," said Mrs. Gulve, "was to see the local newspapers."

She said there was "something about the papers of the various communities I didn't like" until she came to The Eccentric. "A fine looking newspaper, I gained an insight into the area; it was similar to the kind of area we were leaving."

GULVE VISITED the Birmingham-Bloomfield area accompanied by a Detroit friend, then both Mr. and Mrs. Gulve visited here. "We fell in love with the area," she said.

The family moved here six weeks ago. One week ago Mrs. Gulve sat down and wrote a letter to The Eccentric in which she stated:

"The suburban weekly reflects the standards of a community and the pulse of its people, I found, and when it is the only criterion available, its excellence is most important."

Her letter led to this interview. A newspaper, she said, is "where you learn about the community." And this community has "matched my expectations."

THROUGH A NEWSPAPER like The Eccentric, "You get a good picture of the community, its interests and what people are doing. It makes you feel part of the community. You begin to feel a little at home."

Similarities between the Birmingham-Bloomfield area and Montclair are that "people take an active interest in the community and are concerned with keeping its high standard."

She glowed about Birmingham: "... lovely stores... Birmingham is a very, very pretty city... number of beautiful churches... shows a cultural awareness in concerts and dramatic organizations in the area, art galleries."

Mrs. Gulve also was awayed by "junior entertainment, for youngsters" here.

HER FOUR CHILDREN are Christian, 12, an eighth grader at Bloomfield Hills Junior High

School; and, at Vaughan Elementary School, Greta, 11, sixth grade; Ingrid, 6, first grade; and Eric, 4, afternoon kindergarten.

In Montclair, Mrs. Gulve was active in the opera club and the dramatic club, which is the second oldest in the country. Learning about Birmingham, she has seen the St. Dunstan production of "Critic's Choice" and thought it was "excellent" and "very professional."
