**North Adams Social Notes**

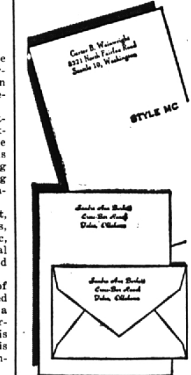
The Carl Schorns of Oakhill Drive have returned home after a colorful journey through the east.
