But, as the team ended league play against Catholic Central Friday night, there were signs of different things to come. The Warriors, a solid underdog, against Central, held their stronger opponents scoreless in the first quarter, scored first and appeared on their way to victory, when the roof caved in.

CATHOLIC Central put together three second-half touchdowns to pull away, 27-7, from Brother Rice. But, the 11 first downs and 225 yards rushing by the Warriors was an indication that things should be changed next year. The victory gave Catholic Cen-
