The subdivision's request was made ostensibly to allow the subdivision time to protest a house plan which conflicts with deed restrictions in the subdivision.

Township Attorney Tom Dillon told the board that the township cannot legally act as an enforcement agency for deed restrictions. He said that a building permit must be issued for a home so long as it meets township requirements.

When building inspector Harold School told the board that his department needs no more than 72 hours to process a building permit application, board members agreed to retain the present 72-hour requirement.

Daniel T. Murphy, former Republican Oakland County clerk-register, was appointed as chairman of the Board of Auditors by a 49-31 vote of the Board of Supervisors last week. His opponent was Robert E. Lilly, Democratic member of the three-man board.

Murphy will take over duties in the administrative post Jan. 1. He will receive \$15,000 annually as a board member and an additional \$4,000 as chairman.
