Mayor Burgum Asks Help for Good Turn Day

Birmingham Mayor William H. Burgum has proclaimed Saturday, Nov. 30, Good Turn Day, as a community-wide project. On that day Boy Scouts of the Detroit Area Council will collect filled bags in the largest clothing drive for Goodwill Industries ever attempted.

Scouts from Southern Oakland, Eastern Macomb and Wayne Counties will distribute the bags Saturday, Nov. 23, to 400,000 homes in metropolitan Detroit.

Bags should be filled by 10 a.m. Good Turn Day and placed in front of one's home to facilitate collection.

Hills Considers Traffic Problem on Opdyke Rd.

The Bloomfield Hills City Commission is seriously considering making Opdyke Road a one-way street north.

Spurred by the fear that the opening of the Chrysler Freeway will add to the traffic upset along the road, commissioners Monday night decided to invite Opdyke residents to a Dec. 10 meeting in order to hear how they feel about the matter.

The action was taken despite a letter from the Auto Club urging the commission not to limit traffic on the city street.

The Auto Club contends:
• That Opdyke is used more by local cars than by transient traffic.
• That making Opdyke a one-way street north would be a detriment to Bloomfield Hills and Bloomfield Township fire departments.
