Residents Helping Michigan Culture

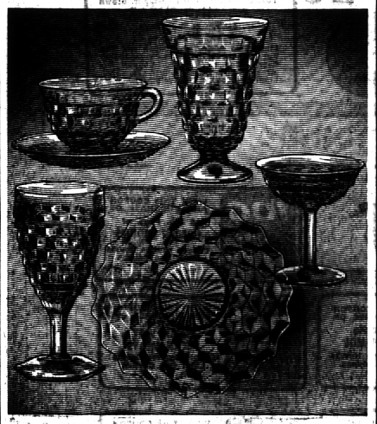
Two local residents are planning for cultural activities to be included in the 1964 celebration of Michigan Week.

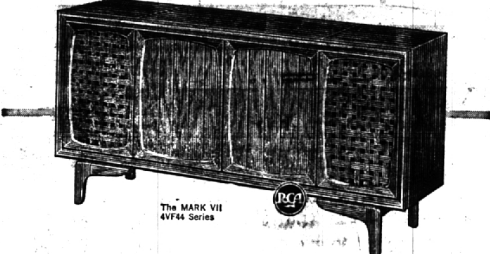
